Explore Warminster

You may have come to see Imber Village, but no visit would be complete without spending some time in the historic market town of Warminster. Warminster offers a great range of shops, many of which are independently owned, providing a unique shopping experience. The town also boasts an impressive heritage with many historic buildings. We hope you have an enjoyable and fun-filled day.

Imber Exhibition

Discover the history of Imber Village at *Imber: The Ghost Village – A walk through the past*, which is being held at the Athenaeum. Enjoy free entry and explore this fascinating exhibition from Friday 16th to Friday 23rd August, 10.30am – 1pm (closed Sunday 18th August). And do look in the Library for a lovely exhibition of cartoons looking at Imberbus, and the places it serves, by Jules, the relief postie for Chitterne.

Shopping

With a good mix of high street brands, together with an array of smaller independent stores, Warminster won't disappoint. Take time to browse the streets and shopping areas – see the Warminster map on pages 6 and 7 for further details.

Food & Drink

Warminster has an excellent choice of eateries that cater for all. While the town features familiar establishments it also boasts a variety of independent cafés, restaurants, pubs and takeaways. In particular, at the Old Bell they will be serving a 1940s-style lunch and snacks and will give some of the proceeds to Imberbus.

Lake Pleasure Grounds

Whilst in Warminster, visit the award-winning Lake Pleasure Grounds. Located in the heart of Warminster, the town's park is packed with facilities including a splashpad, skatepark, tennis courts, putting green and café. During the summer visitors can hire boats and canoes.





INTRODUCING IMBERBUS

In 2009, a group of bus industry professionals achieved a long standing ambition to run a bus service from Warminster in Wiltshire, to the abandoned village of Imber on Salisbury Plain. It proved to be so popular that it has now become an annual event, with most journeys continuing across Salisbury Plain to parts of Wiltshire rarely seen by public transport users. Each year the profits from operating the service are donated to The Friends of St. Giles's Church, Imber, to the Royal British Legion, and to other charities, both local and ones nominated by those who help run the service.

Today we are expecting to run about 40 old and new buses from London and elsewhere, with some with mobility access, to provide a frequent service from Warminster station to Imber and then half-hourly to Gore Cross; thence to New Zealand Farm Camp, to Brazen Bottom and the Lavingtons, or to Tilshead and Chitterne.

The service is designed so that buses meet at Gore Cross Bus Station, to allow passengers to interchange, and thus it should be possible to travel the entire network in four hours or so.

Coming to Imberbus

There is a good train service at Warminster, to and from Cardiff, Newport, Bristol, Bath Spa, Salisbury and the south coast, and local stations. From London, change at Bath Spa, Westbury or Salisbury. Details from www.nationalrail.co.uk.

There are scheduled bus services to and from Warminster, Tilshead and Market Lavington, details at www.traveline.info There will also be a coach excursion from Dorchester. By car, please park in the Western Car Park (Civic Centre) and Central Car Park (off Station Road) in Warminster (see map on Pages 6 and 7) or at the top of Sack Hill, and at Chitterne at the sports field (off the A360). Cars will NOT be allowed into the military training area. Please do NOT park at Gore Cross, Market Lavington and Tilshead. All details at www.imberbus.org

Imberbus Car-Free Day

This year access to Imber is again by bus only; the Army has generously allowed Imberbus access for buses and bus passengers only, on a day when the Salisbury Plain Training Area is closed to all other people and vehicles.

What can I do when I get to Imber?

St. Giles's church is the principal attraction. The church occupies the site of an earlier building dating from the mid-12th century. The nave was re-built towards the end of the 13th century and was followed, circa 1400, by the addition of the north and south aisles, the tower and north porch. At this time the nave roof was re-constructed. The chancel was re-built in 1849 at which time the north-east vestry was built. As the village was evacuated in 1943, it is

conserved by the Churches Conservation Trust and looked after by the Friends of St. Giles's, who will have it open for Imberbus passengers to see the churchyard and interior, the exhibition on the history of Imber, and who will also be serving light refreshments. Please admire the flagpole on the church tower, paid for from the donation from Imberbus 2022. There will also be a display and vehicle from the London Transport Museum and a stand from the Thames Valley and Great Western Omnibus Trust. Please visit these too.

The church, the path to it, and the road through Imber are all available for public use. Everywhere else, including all the other buildings, fields and other land and the derelict tanks is STRICTLY OUT OF BOUNDS. Trespass is prohibited, is dangerous, and the areas will be patrolled by police, the military and by wardens. Failure to heed this advice may make future access to Imber impossible. Please follow all the directions set out on Pages 31 and 32 from the Defence Infrastructure Organization.

Where will I be able to get something to eat or drink?

Light refreshments will be available inside Imber Church, and at Chitterne and Tilshead village halls (and at Tilshead village hall, there will be a sales stand for transport books and souvenirs); also at Caspers Café at Warminster station, which will be open throughout the day. Please also sample the restaurants and pubs in Warminster and along the route. Our buses pass near hostelries at Market Lavington and West Lavington too. The Museum at Market Lavington will be serving cream teas from 10.30am to 5pm; there will be a bus stop in Market Lavington adjacent to the path to the Museum.

What other facilities are available at Imber?

None! As Imber is normally closed to the public there are no shops, no permanent toilets and there is no mobile phone reception or Wifi. We therefore strongly recommend that you prepare for this before you board the bus (the nearest public toilets will be at Warminster station and alongside Warminster Central Car Park).

How much are tickets?

To enable visitors to explore our services in an affordable way, we will again be offering an all-day ticket at a cost of £10 per adult, with all-day tickets for children at £2 each. Please see Page 21 for full details.

Imberbus operates as an ordinary local bus service, so you can pay in advance, but you can also just turn up and pay the conductor on the bus in cash (payment in £5 or £10 notes or £1 and £2 coins is appreciated). To speed things up, we will also sell tickets outside Warminster Station, where payment by contactless card will be accepted. We regret that we are unable to accept concessionary bus passes.

St. Giles's Church


The only original building substantially surving the military occupation from the Second World War is the church.

To the right is a photograph taken from *Imber, Then and Now* by Gordon Lewis, first published in 2015. The view is looking south with the church tower in the distance.

The view below was taken in 2016 from south of the church looking north. Funds raised by the annual Imberbus event over the years have enabled the path to the church to be metalled, railings to be installed, the church to be lit internally, a new display of Imber history, and a new flagpole. Buses will run from outside Warminster Rail Station to Imber approximately every 10-15 minutes between 0930 & 1745, and from Imber Church back to Warminster every 10-15 minutes between 1010 & 1745. Extra buses may also link Sack Hill car park with Imber.

This year extra buses will also link Tilshead, the Lavingtons and Gore Cross with On arrival at Imber, some buses from Warminster will carry on to Gore Cross, then either to Brazen Bottom and the Lavingtons or to New Zealand Farm Camp and these are shown separately at the bottom of the page.

Buses normally arrive at Gore Cross a few minutes before the departure time shown, to enable passengers to change buses.

The Ministry of Defence (MOD) welcomes you to Imber. Please read this leaflet carefully. It will help you make the most of your visit.



Stick to public rights of way

The MOD wants to ensure that visitors to Imber have an enjoyable experience when visiting this historical village. Salisbury Plain is first and foremost a military training area and for your own safety and enjoyment we ask that you stick to public rights of way and designated areas and comply with local flags and signs.





Please don't enter buildings marked 'unsafe'

There are dangerous buildings all around Imber. These buildings are military training features and are unsafe for members of the public. They are always off limits unless notices tell you otherwise. Please do not go inside these buildings.





Disused tank hulks are targets...not playgrounds

You'll see these "hard targets" dotted around Imber. They are not for climbing or playing on; under no circumstance should they be approached. They have been used as targets for many years and are covered by exposed, dangerous metal and small spaces exist where little people could get trapped! They will also be contaminated by munitions or pyrotechnics, which may go off if tampered with.





Don't stray from the path

Imber Range has been used for military training for many years. There is always the possibility that unexploded ordnance may contaminate an area. It is important that you remain in those areas designated for public access where the risk has been managed.



Please remember:

- Landmarc, military staff and volunteers are on site for your safety
- Please respect and adhere to all information and direction when visiting the Plain
- Children should be supervised a all times
- Please take your litter home with you
- If you are visiting with your dog please clean up after it and ensur that it is kept in sight and under close control at all times
